I was full of fear and believed that the only way I could face life was to get in control so that no one could hurt me. As a young adult trying to live for Christ and follow the Christian lifestyle, I knew where He came from, but I didn't know where I was going. I felt that my future would always come together with my past. I thought how could someone with a past like me be okay? It's impossible! But Jesus had a different plan. He said, 'The Spirit of God is upon me.' To preach the good news to the poor, he has sent me to declare freedom to the captives and to restore vision to the blind, just as I send those who are oppressed [who are crushed, bruised, crushed and broken by calamity] (Luke 4:18). Jesus came to open the prison doors and release the captives—and that included me. However, I made no progress until I started believing that I could really be free. I had to get rid of my negative thinking and replace it with a positive vision for my life—God's vision for me. I had to believe that Neither my past nor my health could determine my future. Prayer keeps him at the center of all you do. Years ago I could tell you that I prayed for an hour every day. But now I couldn't even determine how long I was praying, because every time I see or feel the need I just pray. I pray when I drive . I pray while working, and while relaxing. Sometimes I just stop doing what I do and praise God, and that's prayer. I will take care of him and say, My Lord, I am not worried about anything today; I'm nothing.
